VOTE



To vote in Nevada, you must register. To register to vote, you must be a citizen of the United States, be at least 18 years of age (those who are 17 years of age who will be 18 before the next general election may pre-register), have lived in Nevada for at least 30 days and lived in the election precinct for at least 10 days. If you meet these requirements, you can register to vote:

- Online at RegisterToVoteNV.gov
- Automatically when you apply for a driver's license or identification card at the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV)- (If you prefer not to be automatically registered, you will need to fill out an 'opt-out' form available at the DMV-per AB345)
- At the County Clerk/Registrar of Voters' Office
- At the Secretary of State's Office
- At the City Clerk's Office
- At any Post Office
- At Political Party Offices
- At Voter Registration Agencies covered in the National Voter Registration Act
- By mailing in a complete voter registration form
- During early voting or on election day at the polls

To avoid any possible delays in counting your vote when registering at the polls during early voting, or on election day, you may choose to register or update your registration by the Secretary of State's established deadlines:

- By mail or in-person for the Primary Election: **May 12, 2020**, and for the General Election, by mail or in person, **October 6, 2020**.
- Online registration for the Primary Election: **June 4, 2020**, and for the General Election: **October 29, 2020**.
- 3rd Saturday before the election – for a special or recall election not held on the same day as a regularly scheduled primary or general election.

Individuals and groups may conduct voter registration drives at community events and in public places, especially closer to elections. If you register using this method, be mindful that groups are under legal deadlines to submit registration forms to local election officials; so, please check your registration status online [here](#)¹ or by calling your local registrar of voters or county clerk.

Conducting a Voter Registration Drive

Many civic-minded groups and/or individuals conduct voter registration drives. An easy way to be successful is to hold a drive where you work or go to school. (You will need to get your employer's or school's permission)

Once you have permission, prepare to offer online and paper registration options

- Step 1
 - Contact the Nevada Secretary of State's Elections Division (775-684-5705)
 - Request the total amount of voter registration applications you will need
 - If you anticipate registering more than 50 ([NAC 293.425](#)):² Submit a Mail Distribution Plan, which can be downloaded at the web link <https://www.nvsos.gov/sos/elections/voters/voter-registration-drives>
 - To offer an online voter registration option, consider creating a large sign with the online voter registration url: <https://www.registertovotenv.gov/>
- Step 2
 - Determine date, location and time
 - Pick a central location that is easily accessible during a high traffic time
 - Any company or school-wide event is an excellent time
- Step 3
 - Promote the event through social media, email, handouts, and flyers

If you would like to request that the Secretary of State's Office provide approved locations for voter registration drives, please contact the Secretary of State's Office at (775)-684-5705.

To ensure the integrity of the voter registration process, any individual or group conducting a Nevada voter registration drive must adhere to all statutes and regulations and ensure all participants also comply with these statutory requirements ([NRS 293.124](#)).³ These statutory requirements can be found in the Secretary of State's *Guide to Conducting Voter Registration Drives* at the web link <https://www.nvsos.gov/sos/elections/voters/voter-registration-drives>
